The equine swimming pool, spa and veterinary centre is due to be completed in September 2011.

Week seven of the build saw the foundations being completed and the diggers moving in to begin excavating the base of the

pool in the centre of the site.

John Bonsall, project manager reports that "we have completed all the piling for the foundations the initial digging of the recess for the pool. The pool guys will then go away for a few weeks while we put up the building's steel frame, which will take around two weeks to erect. It's an exciting build and all is going to plan!"

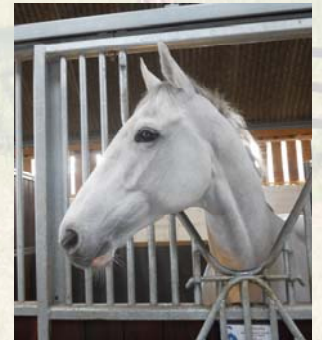
We also welcomed back Highland Colori, owned by Evan Sutherland. Highland is an unraced 3yo and spent all of last season with us but was given time to grow and was sent

Racing round-up

March was a very quiet month for us; the calm before the storm that is the start of the turf season! We only sent out six runners and unfortunately didn't pick up a win, but all our runners ran with credit.

Mr Macattack was our first turf runner of the season on 31 March and he nearly got us off to a flying start at Leicester, just getting pipped at the post by Paul Cole's horse Nimue. We were really pleased with this effort and he is entered on the turf again at Thirsk along with Ballista on Saturday 9 April.

We are purposely two or three weeks behind the schedule that we employed last year and did not target the Brocklesby this time around. Our 1st 2yo runner this year looks like being Van Go Go, a Dutch Art filly owned by Andrew Black, on 7 April at Kempton. She is working well at home and will hopefully show this ability on the track. Our 2nd 2yo runner should be Marford Missile at Newcastle on 8 April for the MHS 4x10 Partnership. There are a few virgin owners to MHS in this Partnership and we hope they get lots of enjoyment from their new venture.

Richard Kingscote has got off to a great start to the season recording wins with outside rides for Milton Bradley and Ralph Beckett. It's always good to see Richard's talents recognised and used by other trainers.

The runners will now come thick and fast from MHS as we get into the turf season proper. Watch this space!

Five to Follow Update

The five to follow competition is now closed to new entries. We received a record 115 entries, 12 more than last year. The most popular horse was the Majestic Missile 2yo colt out of Khawafi, interestingly by the same sire as last year's most popular 2yo, Ballista.

This horse has now been named Marford Missile and hopefully runs 8 April at Newcastle for 32 entrants!

The most popular older horse selected was Jonny Mudball and the most popular 3yo was Ballista. Gentle Lord's half sister, by Lucky Story was the most selected 2yo filly. She is yet to be named and is part of the MHS 8x8 Partnership, in which there are still shares available.

Mr Macattack was the first horse to earn points in the competition, which got Arthur Merchant off to a flyer with 8 points earned before anyone else has even got out of the blocks!

Don't forget that we have changed the scoring system for this year's competition such that horses pick up more points in Group races and Heritage Handicaps. We also have a transfer window half way through the season which allows you to swap up to two horses for £5 each.
